Additionally, in certamen (Latin quiz bowl), we placed 5th in Latin 1 with a team of Grayson Cobb, Sawyer Griffy, Hannah Dodson, and Lily Oliver. Our advanced team repeated as state champions with a 200-80-10 victory in the finals; the members of that team were Zachary Costa, Emily Caldarelli, Asa Ruiz, and Sarah Lee.

Any time students place in an event, they earn Sweepstakes points for their school. Emily Caldarelli was the individual with the 8th most Sweepstakes points in the state. Schools are separated into divisions based on how many delegates they bring to convention and Rossview also placed first in our division in Sweepstakes points.
